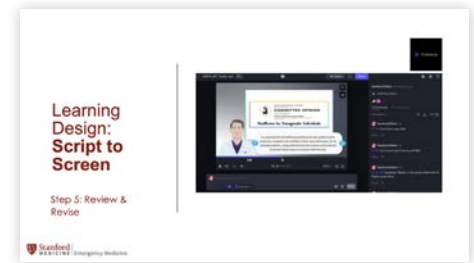
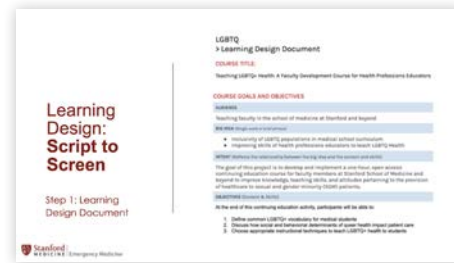

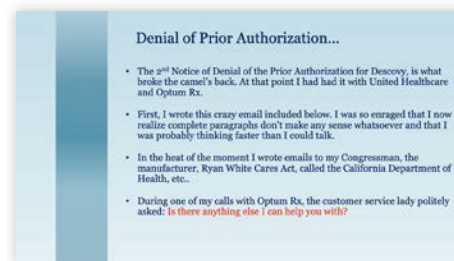
WEBINARS

In honor of the week, the Coalition held two dynamic webinars. These events had great attendance, with more than 950 participants attending each of the webinars.



“The Making of Stanford’s “Teaching LGBTQ+ Health: Training a New Generation of Affirming Health Providers and Educators” featured speakers from Stanford Medicine as they discussed the importance of aligning prevention and care delivery with evidence-based, culturally sensitive standards of care for LGBTQ+ patients.

“PrEP Access, Uptake, and Continued Community Challenges” featured a great lineup of speakers from HealthHIV, the HIV+Hepatitis Policy Institute, and My Brother’s Keeper. This webinar covered the new requirements in private insurance to cover PrEP, social determinants of health and their real-world impact on PrEP access and utilization, and the connection between awareness of PrEP and access to and use of PrEP in Black and Brown communities.
